THE COURT: I, again, as to the proposed testimony 4 of Mr. Hill, I'm going to sustain the defendant's, or the 5 State's objection as was set forth in the Motion in Limine. 6 7 I don't believe Mr. Hill's testimony was specifically addressed in that motion, but for the same reasons, I'm going 8 to not allow him to testify before this jury as to what he 9 10 has testified to and the offer of proof here today.
